When conceiving a plan for Muse, the first order of business for Bill Eager—the landscape architect who founded SGS2 and is a partner in the Sieger Suarez architectural firm—was to ensure that the residential building would cohere with its surroundings. So he continued the Medjool date palms and silver buttonwood trees on Collins Avenue and the public beach walk, respectively. Thirty-six years of landscape work around the world have prepared the Fort Lauderdale-based Rhett Roy for one of its buzziest commissions to date: the 7-acre grounds of **The Ritz-Carlton Residences**, **Miami Beach**. Large trees, such as gumbo limbos, live oaks, sabal palms and royal poincianas will provide canopy cover, while timber bamboo species will grace the exterior of the building along the waterfront villas for a lush look and feel.
